Spiritual Care Approach in Seniors Care: History, Assessment and Referral

This workshop will review the roles of the various health care team members in providing spiritual care to seniors. It will focus on the use of the spiritual history and the significance of the spiritual assessment in creating the spiritual care plan. The workshop is practical in nature and will introduce a spiritual assessment tool that can be used in your long term care home or community group. Discussion will center on the use of the tool and development of a spiritual care plan, through assessment, interventions and outcomes.
